All About the YAN

Origin:

The YAN was birthed out of the Overbrook Park Church of Christ, Philadelphia, PA, by Brother Brian Murray. Brother Murray, along with five additional young leaders in his congregation, were charged by Minister Willie Rupert, Jr. with creating a program for young adults in the church. Although it was originally requested that a college outreach program be formed, YAN successfully developed a vision and structured a plan to launch as a networking ministry instead. Since January 2008 this ministry has grown and expanded into several states with aspirations of transcending international borders.

Biblical Principles:

YAN is based off the following Biblical principles:

1 Tim 4:12– Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity.

Philippians 2:4– Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.
